Weekly report: 1st – 7th May 2021

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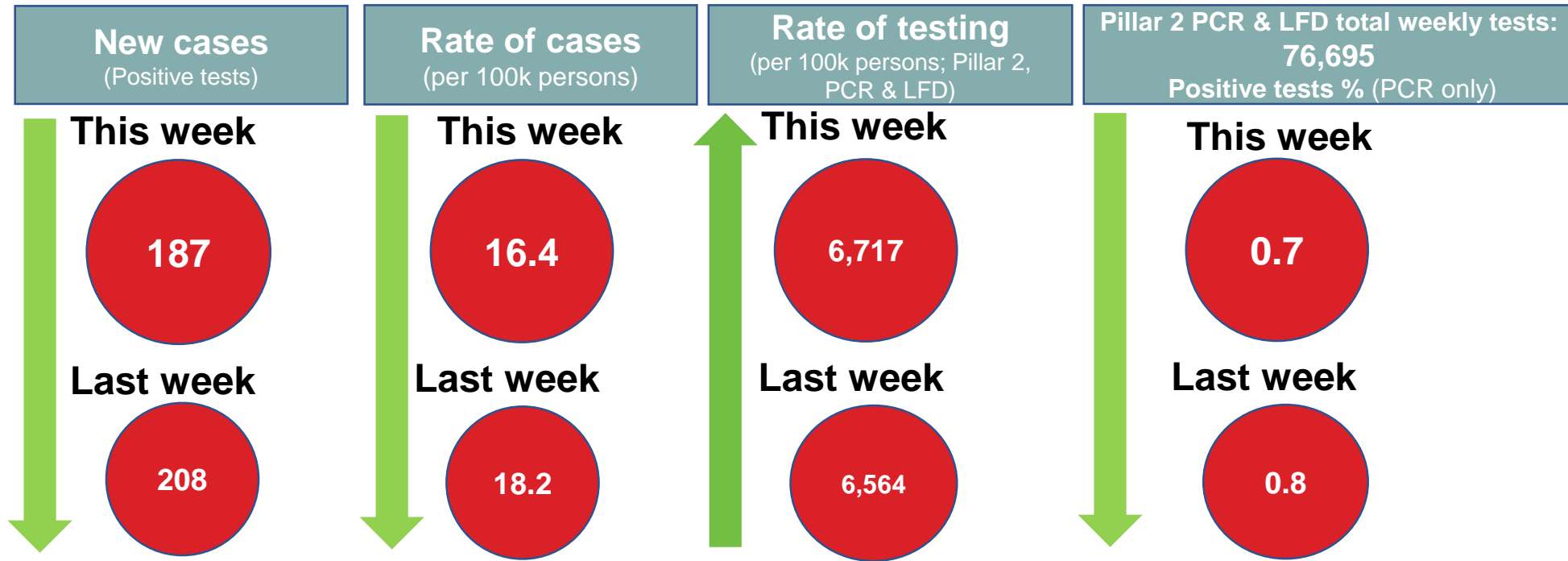

New cases have continued to fall over the past week, along with the overall case rate and the % of positive tests. The rate of testing using PCR, LFD or both has increased.

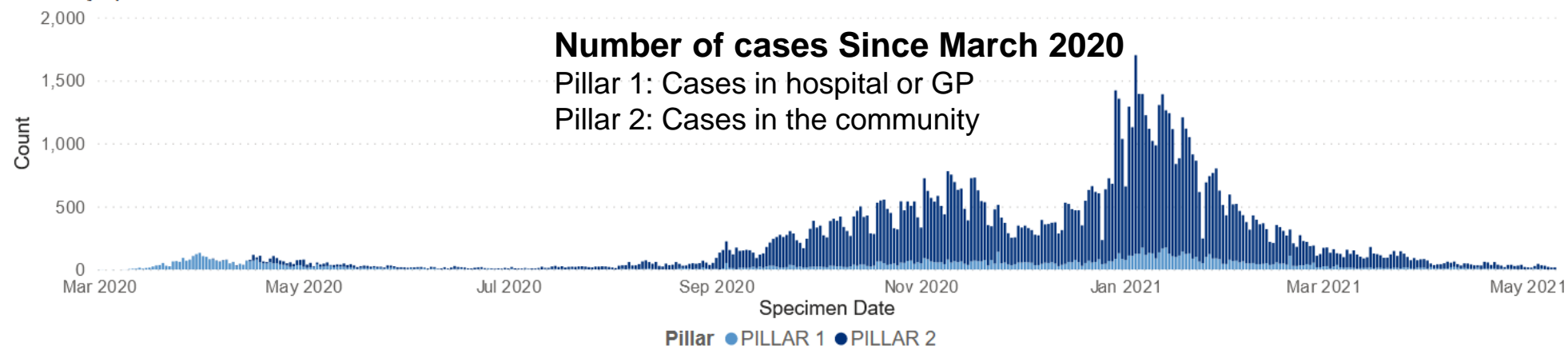
All adults who don't have symptoms should now be testing twice a week using the rapid lateral flow tests. Testing for asymptomatic individuals is now available [across the city](#) and you can also order test kits directly from the government for [free by post](#) or find a [local collection site](#).

Spread appears to be primarily occurring through household, social and workplace interactions. Spread often happens in the home but it isn't inevitable, and www.germdefence.org can help.

The average daily COVID admissions remained low this week with around 6 new cases a day across the hospitals in the city, slightly up from around 9 last week. The number of deaths dropped to 1 from 2 deaths last week.

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Across Birmingham, the number of cases decreased by 19 cases compared with last week. Edgbaston is experiencing an outbreak at the moment, and this is being investigated by the HPR Team. 11 wards reported no new cases this week.

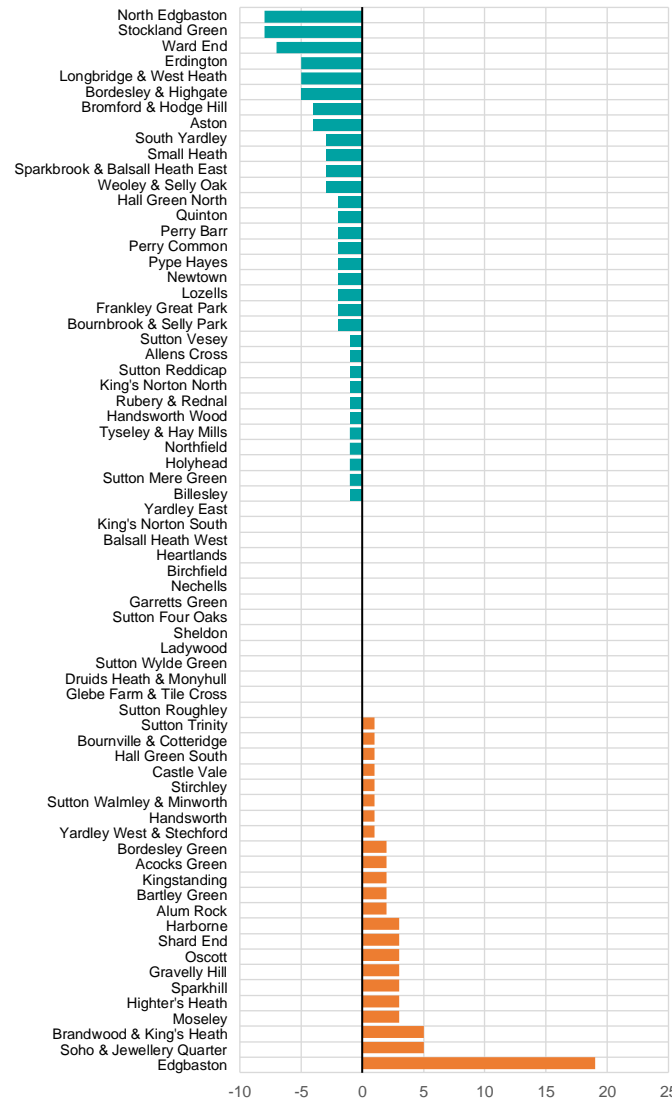
The wards with the highest case rates (cases per 100,000 residents) in the last week are:

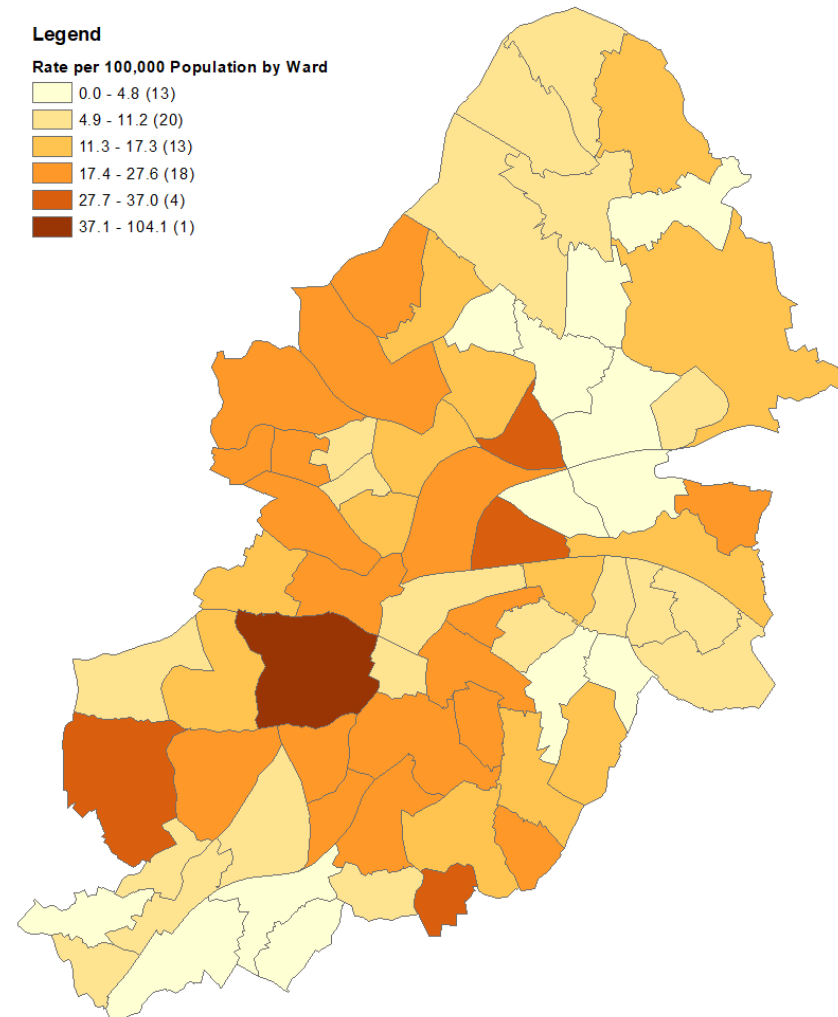
Total cases fell in all age groups apart from the 0-19 year olds, which increased by 8, making this the age group with the most cases. Cases fell slightly in the Asian and Black communities and rose slightly in the White and Mixed/Other groups, but these changes were small in number so are unlikely to be of concern.

Confirmed Cases by Ward 1st to 7th May 2021 (Pillar 1 & Pillar 2 Tests)

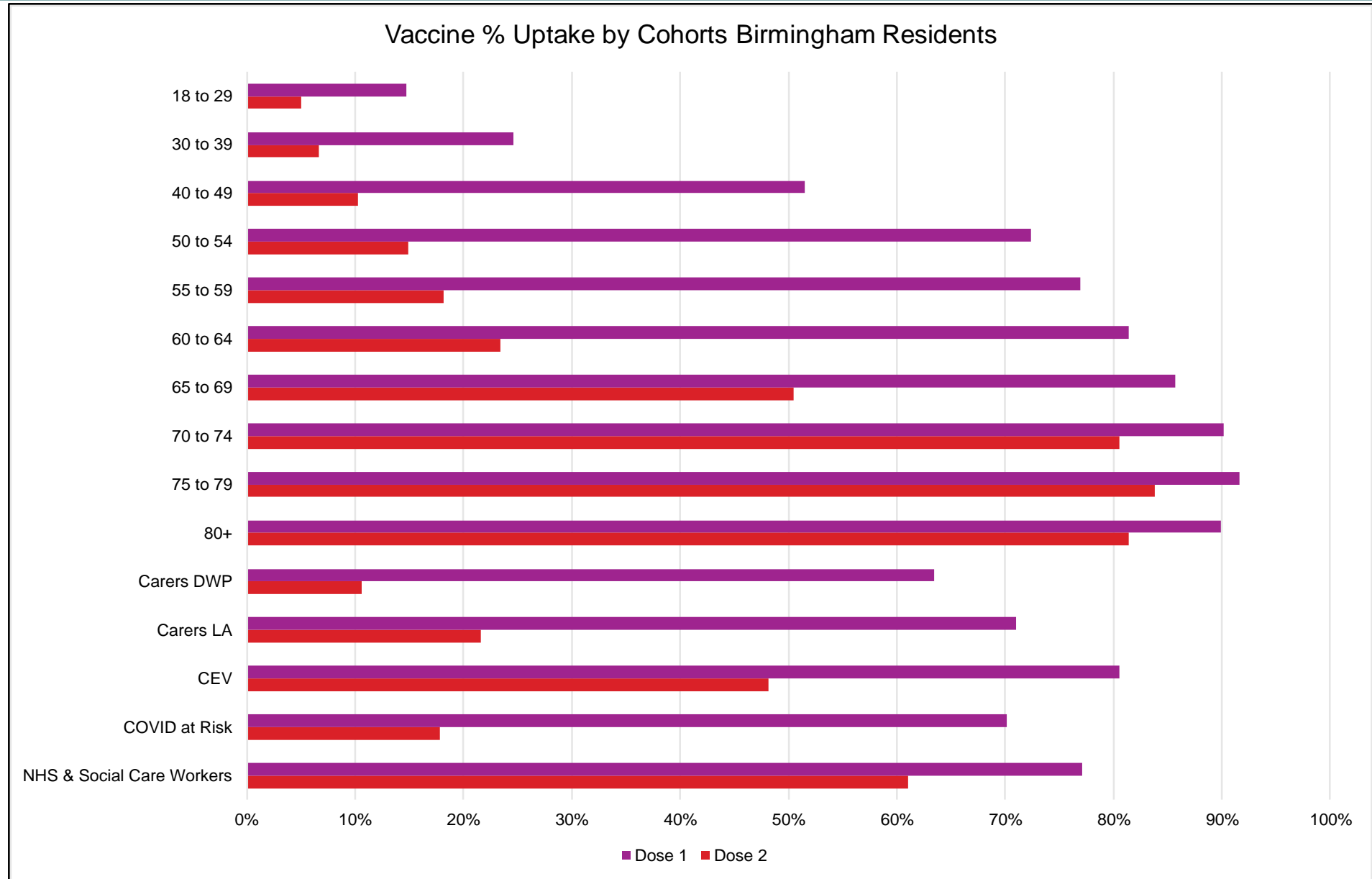



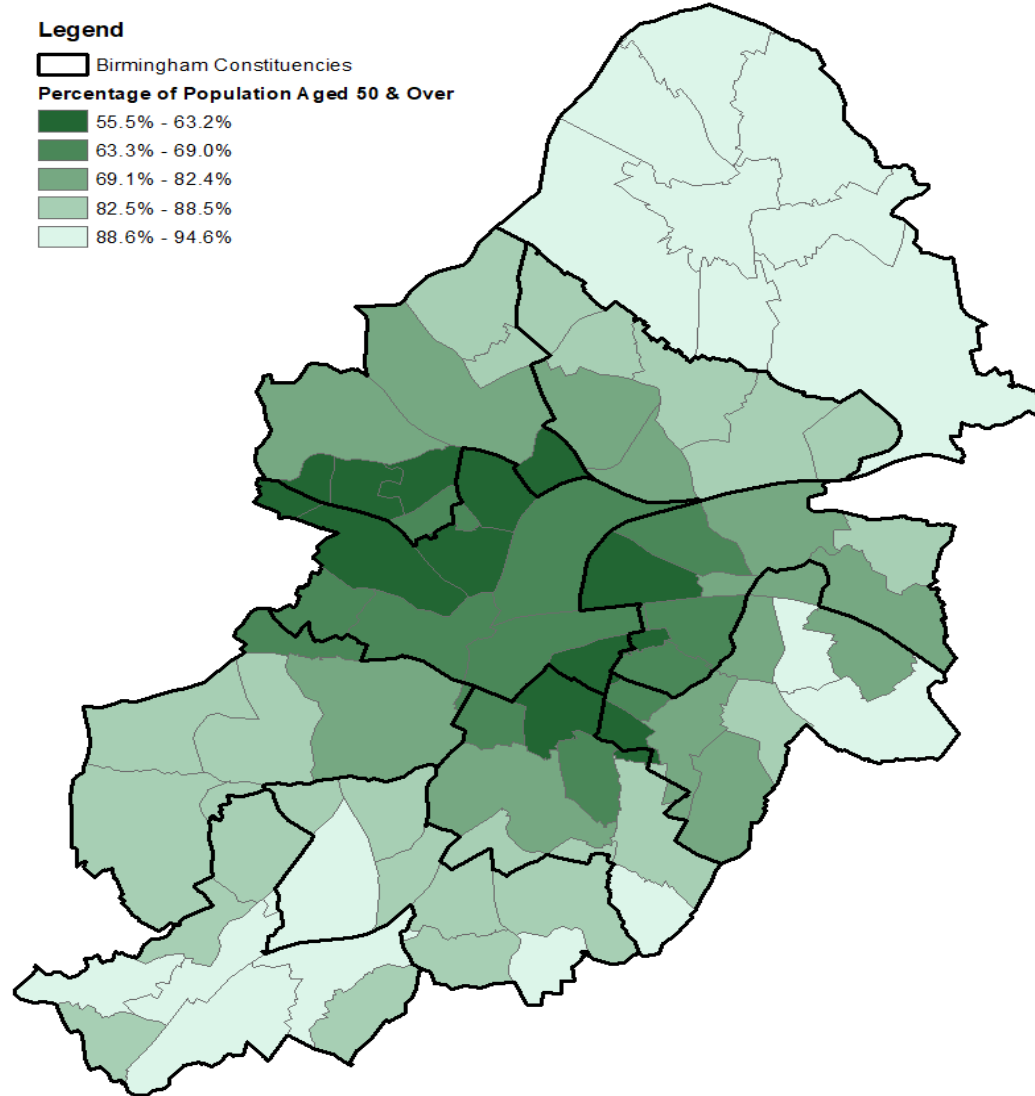
